.DISCUSSION...

Light morning rain showers are possible, with a slight chance (15-20% probability) of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon. Main impacts with these storms will be gusty erratic winds as well as lightning. Expect a renewed slight chance (15-25% probability) of showers and thunderstorms again on Saturday, better chances on Sunday (30-40% probability). A gradual downward trend in temperatures is forecast from Friday through Saturday with increasing humidity recovery. Cooler and wetter Sunday.

Sky/weather.....Partly cloudy. Slight chance of showers in the morning. Slight chance of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon.
