.DISCUSSION...Westerly winds continue just under 10 mph until midnight, when they ease to around 5 mph. By 2 or 3 am Monday they veer northerly at 5 mph and switch to an easterly bearing by noon. RH values overnight climb from the current value of 30% and peak around 48 - 50%. Southerly winds pick up in the late afternoon to around 10 mph. The lowest RH values will be in the mid teens, forecast to be around 17% RH, 1600 to 1800 PST Winds veering to a west southwest bearing just before dusk. Recovery RH values overnight into Tuesday, 23 - 37%.

Maintain situational awareness. Look up, Look down, Look around

Stay hydrated!!! Time to think = time to drink. Document rest and hydration on 214.

Remain mindful of what is going on around you! LCES!

Avoid complacency!!!! Experiencing extreme fire behavior due to low live and dead fuel moistures and elevated fire danger rating values.

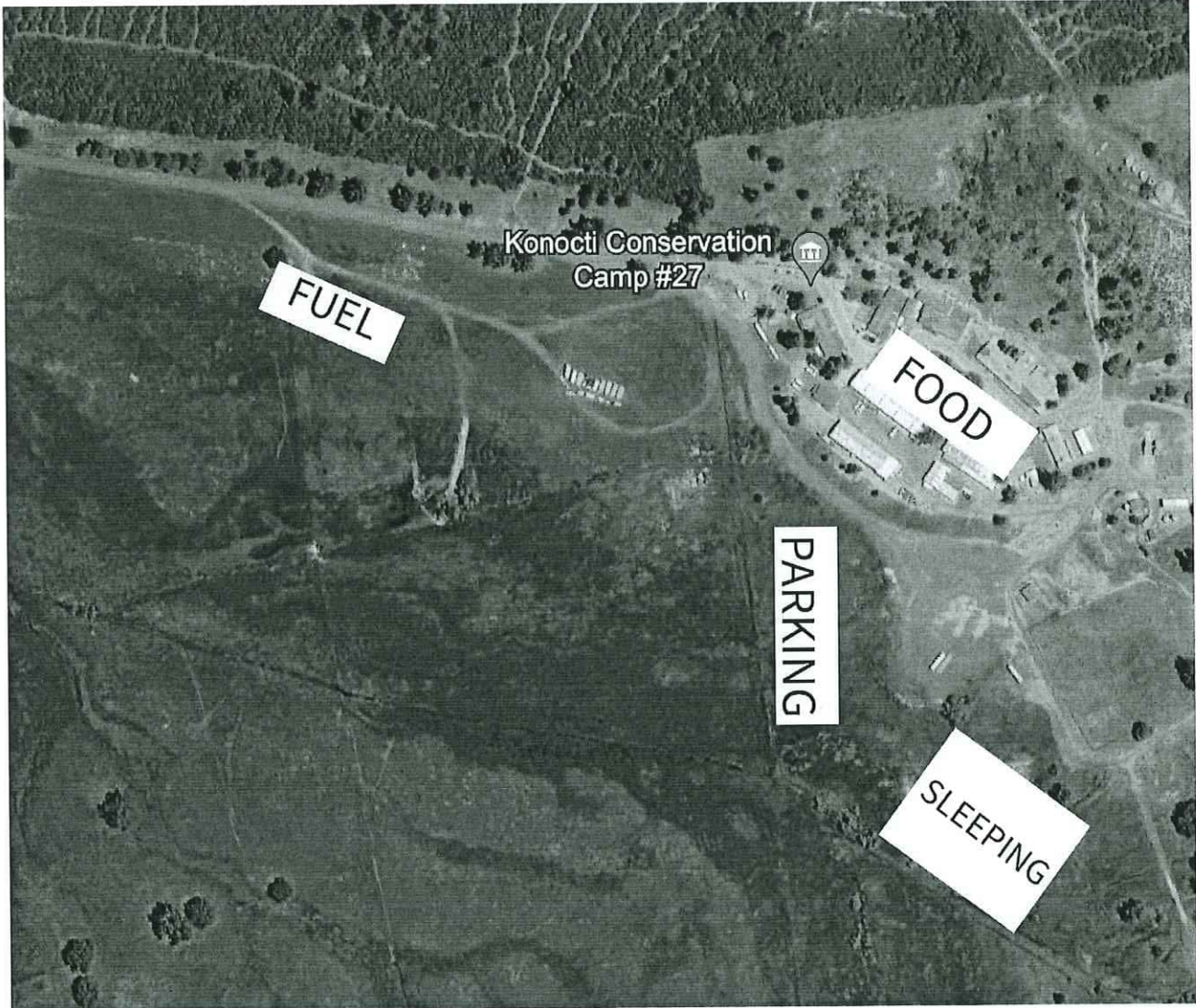
